The New Sanctuary Movement

In the 1980's, faith communities began housing Central American refugees who fled their home countries but did not receive asylum in the US. In today's anti-immigrant environment, a new sanctuary movement has emerged, providing physical and political shelter to undocumented migrants along with financial, emotional and spiritual support. In worship we will explore this renewed movement and invite us to consider how we might act in these times. A discussion with the Sanctuary Task Force and leaders from outside the congregation will follow the service.

In the spirit of this month's theme, "welcome," this is also a **"Bring a Friend"**Sunday. Do you know someone who you think would love WUS? Who among you is concerned about the current immigration crisis? We would love to draw the circle wide for this important morning of reflection and discussion.

Our Time for All Ages will include a **Blessing of the Backpacks** so be sure to bring your backpack, briefcase, purse, diaper bag or other satchel to worship.

This Sunday, we share our gifts with the Sanctuary Team of our sibling congregation, **First Parish Bedford**. The FPB congregation has voted to become a "Level One" Sanctuary church and has almost completed physical renovations to welcome an individual or family to live in sanctuary.

Team Redo has been working all year on renovation plans for the Michelsen Room to refresh and restore it to the beautiful treasure it once was. With initial funds from a generous donor, work began this summer. **We need your help to finish!** With your generous donation, we will:

- Replace the old sofas with new, more comfortable seating by the new candle-filled fireplace
- Add wall to wall carpeting for a quieter meeting space and flexibility in room rearrangement
- Add new club chair seating in the beautiful stained-glass window bay
- Add light fixtures that better match the character of the room
- Replace the plastic office conference table with four club-style tables
 providing flexibility to be used separately or together as a long boardroom
 table; replace heavy office chairs with chairs that can more easily be
 moved!
- Restore, frame and hang valuable architectural drawings that are presently stored, unseen, in our Archives

Good news! We have already raised \$17,000 of the \$34,000 needed to renovate this distinctive room; so far, checks have ranged from \$50 to \$5000. All amounts are truly appreciated! Please help us toward our goal of raising the remaining \$17,000.

For those in your life concerned about the current anti-immigrant climate and what individuals as well as houses of worship can do, this church service and follow-up discussion will be most compelling.



Another Beagle has joined the WUS leadership team. Rev. Heather has adopted a sweet 6 year old dog, Temple, from the same rescue group that brought Dobby to Alison. Temple has visited the office once and has proven to be a good listener and keeper of confidences.

As Temple is having trouble believing that her new human will come home every day, in consultation with church leaders, the office is starting a pilot "Beagle in Residence"



program. On Thursdays, visitors to the office may meet Dobby or Temple. Those who love dogs and want more dog time in their lives are encouraged to visit on Thursdays. Those who have business in the office and are not fond of dogs or allergic are encouraged to let us know in advance and we will make other arrangements for the BIRs and/or meet with you in another room at WUS.
