I send this note to all the households we connected with in response to the State of Emergency related to the Coronavirus pandemic. Thank you for taking the time to either talk by phone or to complete our "needs and gifts" survey. We seek to ensure that our members and friends receive the practical, emotional and spiritual support needed to navigate these strange times as best as we can.

Update: to the best of our knowledge, no one in our congregation has contracted COVID-19.<sup>1</sup> However, we learned through the survey that some are experiencing significant financial challenges as a direct result of the shutdown. While members and friends haven't asked for financial support, generous donors to the Ministerial Discretionary Fund – before and after the pandemic – provided us the resources to offer funds to these households. These gifts have been acknowledged and appreciated. Also, as we are now unable to collect donations of supplies (Huggies and Pediasure) for the LexRAP family we are supporting, we are shipping these supplies directly to the family, the cost covered by the MDF.
