### Social Action & Outreach

Our Social Action and Outreach committee has just awarded the UU Service Committee one of our grants this year for their work in Honduras. Working in partnership with Fundacion San Alonso Rodriguez, they are supporting Indigenous environmental activists who protested against the major health hazards resulting from iron oxide mining in the Carlos Escaleras National Park. The surrounding communities will be impacted by wastewater disposal into the Guapinol river. Extractive industries contribute to the long list of forces driving people to leave home and migrate to the U.S. In this way we are being a small piece of the solution to the immigration dilemma.

**Honor the special women in your life.** Every year we support the <u>Women's Lunch Place</u>, a safe, welcoming day shelter community that provides healthy meals and individualized services to women experiencing homelessness and poverty. They have continued to creatively provide meals during the pandemic. Your \$25 can provide a week of meals and, at the same time, give you a way of honoring the special women in your life. Each year, the card features artwork created by a WLP guest through our <u>Creative Expressions program</u>. In a reflection of the resilience shown by the women they serve, this year's design is a vibrant collage crafted from fragments of greeting cards and Mother's Day designs from years past.

The Mother's Day Walk for Peace is a beloved Boston tradition and celebration of our potential to create more peaceful communities. It supports the Louis D. Brown Peace Institute's (LDBPI) by honoring the lives of loved ones who have been murdered. "This year our walk will be held online. Walk virtually with us as we celebrate 25 years of walking for peace! Join our 25 Days of Walking, beginning in April, leading up to our online broadcast on May 9, 2021 at 9:00 a.m.

Who Lives in Winchester? Housing Options – Past and Future, is the title of a two-part zoom program presented by the Network for Social Justice, the Planning Board,

and the Winchester Housing Partnership Board, on Wednesday evenings April 28<sup>th</sup> and May 26<sup>th</sup> from 7:30 – 9 pm.

Winchester completed a comprehensive master planning process last year that identified shared values and goals, including: to create and preserve affordable and accessible housing; to expand community initiatives that increase diversity; and to build a welcoming and supportive community that promotes well-being and positive mental health for all.

The process of reaching these goals through housing initiatives is long overdue in Winchester. We are excited to be offering this joint program to promote conversations about both the historical context that created the Winchester we know today, and what we need to do to move Winchester toward a community that is both more diverse and inclusive.
