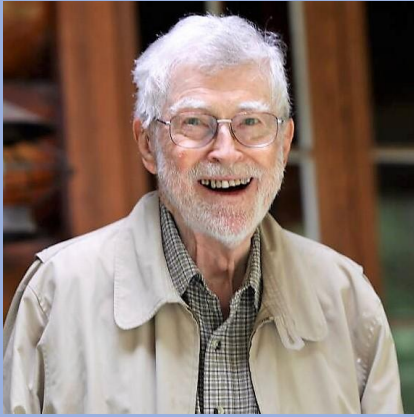
This Sunday!! Winchester Unitarian Society Annual Meeting Sunday, May 16th, 2021

Memorial Wreath Creation and Ceremony

It has become an annual tradition - creating a wreath made of plants and herbs symbolizing courage, grief and remembrance and placing it before the World War I statue near the WUS building in recognition of Memorial Day. It was too risky to do last year but this year we will create and dedicate a wreath the day before our Memorial Day Sunday service. Footage from this ceremony will be included in the Sunday service.

Construction will be done outdoors. Despite CDC guidelines permitting vaccinated people to be outdoors without masks, the Town of Winchester requests that we wear

masks while creating and presenting the wreath.

This event is open to people of ALL ages and friends outside the WUS community. Let's gather to remember, to create and to honor together!

From the Music Committee:

Our 15th concert series ended with Kemp Harris on April 17th. It was a fun and lively evening, and Kemp kept us glued to the screen. We raised \$1145 from door donations, \$572.50 of which will go to the UU Urban Ministry. Our concert series ended on an upbeat note, raising \$12,710 for the year with close to \$2100 to divide among Mystic Valley NAACP, Winchester ABC and UU Urban Ministry. Nourish Your Spirit Spiritual Practice in Community

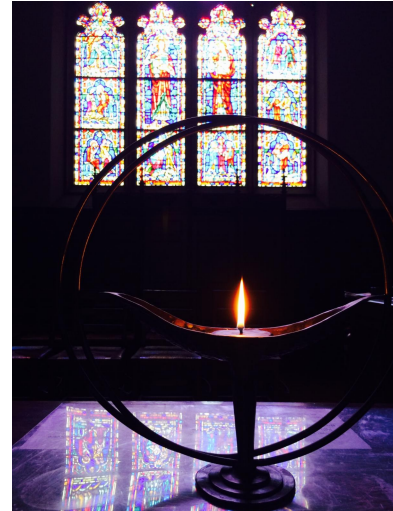

Your Racial Justice Team Planning Group warmly welcomes you—yes, you!—into this conversation. Join us in open-minded, open-hearted discussion.

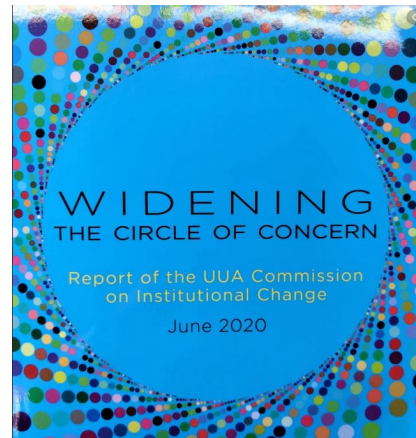
