

Memorial Wreath Creation and Ceremony Saturday, May 29th, 12:30 PM (Weather Permitting) Outdoors at WUS

It has become an annual tradition - creating a wreath made of plants and herbs symbolizing courage, grief and remembrance and placing it before the World War I statue near the WUS building in recognition of Memorial Day. It was too risky to do last year but this year we will create and dedicate a wreath the day before our Memorial Day Sunday service. Construction will be done outdoors. Despite CDC guidelines permitting vaccinated people to be outdoors without masks, the Town of Winchester requests that we wear masks while creating and presenting the wreath.



The Racial Justice Planning Group offers the following quotation as a way to spark thinking and discussion of what it means to be anti-racist:


"The opposite of racist isn't 'not racist.' It is 'antiracist'...One either allows racial inequities to
