Just knowing that these organizations and services exist is a wonderful help.

Just to give you an idea of the contents here are a few things in it:

Contact information for many social services: Food Assistance, Utility Assistance, Debt Reduction Assistance. There is information about Mental Health Services, such as NAMI (the National Alliance on Mental Health). And there are lists of Literacy or GED programs ... and even Thrift Shops in the area.

Memorial Wreath Creation and Ceremony Saturday, May 29th, 12:30 PM (Weather Permitting) Outdoors at WUS

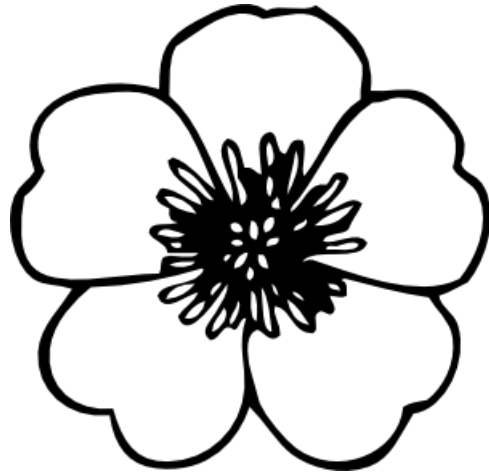

Building Beloved Community, Resource by Resource

The fourth Thursday of each month the Racial Justice Team invites us to explore a resource together. This week we feature **Winfred Rembert**, Black American artist, who died March 31, 2021, in New Haven, Connecticut.

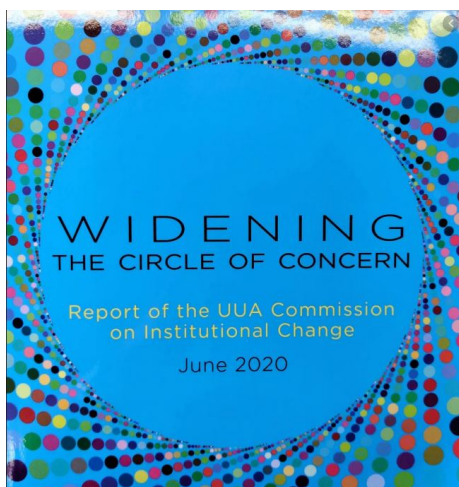
In 2014, St. Mary's Church Peace and Justice Committee and the Winchester Multicultural Network (now Network for Social Justice, nfsj.org) screened a documentary of Rembert's life, All Me. Perhaps you attended?

And, the May 10 New Yorker featured his art, painful life scenes hand tooled on leather and painted. In the accompanying article Rembert described his experience as a young man serving in a chain gang. His seven years of hard labor followed a lynching that he had survived. That attempted murder was in 1967. Yes, 1967.

In a poignant brief film we are able to learn firsthand of Rembert's trauma, resilience, creativity, and love. There are harsh scenes, and they are the reality of our nation's history. The video concludes with a memorial service honoring the unrecognized victims of lynchings.
