I Remember Clifford was written by the jazz saxophonist Benny Golson in memory of his friend and colleague Clifford Brown, the great jazz trumpeter who tragically died in an auto accident at the age of 25. This morning's Litany of Remembrance is adapted from a Catholic Litany of the Saints composed by John Becker. The Offertory is the central movement of the Requiem by German composer Johannes Brahms. Brahms composed this large-scale work after the death of his mother in 186; it was completed in 1869.
