# Music Notes:

The Kindling music this morning is the very beautiful *Barakaat,* meaning blessing in Arabic, by South African pianist Abdullah Ibrahim from his 1998 album *African Suite.* • The solo, offered in this month of Awakening, is by the African-American composer Florence Price with text by James Joseph Burke. • We conclude with two Easter favorites, the Hallelujah Chorus and the Widor toccata. Note that while the Hallelujah chorus is often sung at Christmas, it is celebrating the passion and resurrection of Christ, coming at the end of Part II of the oratorio *The Messiah*.
