Today's music centers around hope. Ysaye Barnwell is best known for her role in leading the vocal ensemble *Sweet Honey in the Rock*. Her version of *Hope* was first recorded in 1998. Lars Jansson is a Swedish jazz pianist and composer, and his thoughts on *Hope* were first recorded in 1999.
