Renewal and Growth: Pledge Progress Update 3/8/23

As the pledge drive winds down, we continue to be optimistic that we will raise 7% more than we did last year and reach \$400,000.

As of March 13th, we have collected 73 pledges totaling \$282,104. We have reached 62% of our participation goal and 71% of our financial goal.

We send our sincere thanks to everyone who has already pledged generously!



Help us prepare gardens for the new local community project:

Gardens for Good (G4G) Growing food locally for our neighbors in need

Come help prepare garden spaces for planting for this new community project. This may include shoveling and spreading compost, turning soil and, possibly, adding fencing to keep out pests.

If you have not already heard, here's the backstory about this exciting new local community project:

"The basic premise of this project is to take a small portion of the abundant available suburban lawns and convert them into food production for our local food pantries. This will address several needs: First, increasing the availability of fresh, local, healthy food to the diets of pantry patrons. We would like to emphasize regenerative growing practices to increase awareness for growing food in an ecologically sustainable way that recarbonizes the soil. We would also like to foster a more communal effort in food production that is for purposes other than for personal consumption.

We're recruiting landowners who are interested in sharing yard space and volunteer gardeners to work these garden plots.... We're coordinating with the Council of Social Concern, the En Ka Food Pantry and other local pantries to determine what fresh produce needs their patrons would be happy to receive. Adrienne Altstatt, the farmer at Wright Locke Farm, will design the gardens and coordinate the gardeners. " from Fred Yen, 12/5/22

Religious Education

This past Sunday we read a story called *I Color Myself Different* by Colin Kaepernick. It was a lovely story about embracing difference and talking about it honestly and openly. In the story young Colin learns about his identity as a person of color and who inspired him.

In RE, we had our regular classes for the first time in a while. The Spirit Play class heard a story about how one snowflake – or one person – can make a difference. In Neighboring Faiths, we explored what the word "religious" means to each of us and what kinds of places and activities we think of as religious.

This Sunday, March 19th: RE Classes for K-6

Spirit Play. This Sunday, the Spirit Play class will hear a story called "The Magic Seed." This story explores how sometimes we might judge another person too harshly and that we all have made mistakes and deserve mercy, understanding, and forgiveness.

Neighboring Faiths. This Sunday, Neighboring Faiths will start to study Judaism in earnest. We'll look at our World Religions book for some information and also do some fun games and have snack.

Build-a-Quilt Winter Service Project: March 26th

We have only made three quilts so far for our winter service project for both RE classes. We're now holding a Love in Action church-wide event on March 26th after church to try to get these quilts made. While parents are taking part in the Listening Session for Standing Committee from 12 to 1, kids and other adults will be busy making quilts!

Build-a-Bed is a nonprofit organization that enlists groups to make beds for children who don't have them. (Here's a great video about the organization: https://www.abedforeverychild.org/about-us.) FCCW will be holding the event at their church on March 18th, where they will use the materials from Build-a-Bed to construct beds. FCCW let us know that they have 6 more slots open if a family or two would like to join them in making beds on the 18th.

WUS Spaghetti Dinner: Friday, March 24th

Neighboring Faiths Visit to Shir Tikvah: Friday, March 31st

As part of the Neighboring Faiths curriculum, we'll be studying different faith traditions within the Abrahamic faiths of Judaism, Christianity, and Islam. With each unit, we'll be visiting with our neighbors at one of their typical worship services. Our first visit will be to Temple Shir Tikvah to

experience a Friday night Shabbat service. The service starts at 7:30 pm. We'll plan to arrive at the temple by 7 pm so that we can enter, check in with our host, and find a seat before things begin. Some parents have expressed interest in joining together for dinner beforehand. More on that to come. Aberjona Canoe Trip and River Cleanup Spring Service Project: Saturday, April 29th (rain date of Saturday, May 6th)

Building Beloved Community Concept

Have you ever heard someone say, "I do not see color." Or, maybe, "I am colorblind. I do not see race."

Kimberle W. Crenshaw, Columbia University civil rights scholar, in her 2022 induction into the American Academy of Arts and Sciences said: "I cannot shake off the worry that the attacks on knowledge, and on our very democracy have reached unimaginable heights in part, because of the unfinished work of grappling with our nation's racial history, and our profound discomfort in talking about it, We are at the point where the **colorblind sweet spot** has created a bitter harvest. Racism has been a route through which anti-democratic politics have become mainstream."

She continues, "Of course, the resort to being silent about endangering conditions would make little sense in the context of, say, the toxic consequences of substances built into our physical infrastructure, like asbestos or lead...And it makes no more sense to suppress vital knowledge about the toxic dimensions of our history."

This crucible of discomfort operates on both sides of political partisanship. By those "...who wax nostalgic for the time when freedom was enjoyed by only a privileged few, but it is also shared by all too many who are truly horrified by our past...and who choose to deal with our nation's ugliness by ignoring it."

Denying the residual distortions of our racist history on our shared community infrastructure deepens divisions. Colorblindness has never been a "sweet" alternative.
