The Birch, our morning's offertory, comes from a set of five piano pieces Jean Sibelius (composer of a favorite hymn tune *Finlandia*) wrote. In these pieces, Sibelius is said to have portrayed how, "the trees speak to him". Other tree music includes Scott Joplin's iconic *Maple Leaf Rag* (note that maple sugaring season is beginning). ♦ We also celebrate our community with Brian Tate's *We Are One.* Tate's text is adapted from Deuteronomy 6:4-9. ♦ We begin the service with a reminder of the power of our love reaching out in a song from the folk duo *Emma's Revolution.* ♦ And the Kindling music refers to Summerland, "the pinnacle of human spiritual achievement in the afterlife". Surely a place to aspire to.
